Approximately 90% of Aotearoa's wetland areas have disappeared due to land development.

Botanica by Airwick and WWF-New Zealand, in a three year partnership, are will be working to reblossom our unique biodiversity by planting native flowering species to help regenerate and restore the biodiversity of these vital ecosystems.

In 2021, WWF-New Zealand and Botanica by Airwick worked with Ngāti Toa Rangatira, Porirua City Council, Wellington City Council, and Greater Wellington Regional Council to plant some 8,800 flowering natives, covering more than 5,000m² of the Porirua stream.

In 2022, WWF and Botanica collaborated with Te Ara Hīkoi, Auckland Golf, Auckland Rowing Club, and Panama Road School. Together, with the support of the Department of Conservation and Auckland City Council, we planted more than 9,000 natives to support the restoration of four key environmental sites across Auckland.

In 2023, WWF and Botanica are moving their partnership to Waitaha (Canterbury) and joining forces with the Department of Conservation, Forest & Bird Canterbury, Golf New Zealand, Timaru District Council, and Predator Free Canterbury. Together, they will be planting around 9,000 natives at sites in Gleniti, Temuka, Geraldine, Pleasant Point Golf Course, and on Te Ara trail.

“Collaborative conservation has made it possible for Project #ReBlossomNZ to plant nearly 28,000 native plants across Aotearoa. WHY PROJECT #REBLOSSOMNZ?

Every little thing is connected. From humans to plants, animals, fungi, and micro-organisms, and the ecosystems where they live – each work together within their ecosystems to maintain balance and support life.

Biodiversity supports everything in nature that humans, and our fellow species, need to survive: food, clean water, medicine, and shelter. It is the essence of our existence.

Māori have always respected the importance of our ecosystem and lived as a part of nature, rather than apart from nature. This can be seen in tapu – a complex guiding rule system/ritenga. If mauri (life force, life spirit) is shifted within the environment, it has a greater impact on all related components.

If we take care of the land, live in harmony with nature, we can care for our people. This knowledge comes with the responsibility of kaitiakitanga (guardianship) of our world from sea to sky, not just for ourselves, but for future generations.

Project #ReBlossomNZ 2023 will help restore the health and

well-being of over 5600 m² across South Canterbury.

Habitat destruction in New Zealand is already having devastating impacts, leaving us with only 10% of wetlands, 38% of forests, and 49% of streams. As a result, we are ranked the worst in the world for threatened species.

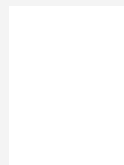
